We support spay & neuter programmes, free medical services for homeless dogs & dogs living in poverty with their families.

We run programmes which give homeless dogs and dogs with their families living in poverty food security.

Education which improves the lives of homeless dogs and dogs living in poverty with their families is an important part of our mission.

Our programmes are delivered via our monthly magazine & our radio station Dog Desk Radio which broadcasts 24hrs a day, 7 days a week to the United Kingdom, Canada & America.

Our work isn't limited and we will respond to new, difficult situations that vulnerable dogs & dogs living in poverty find themselves in.

Dog Desk animal action is a dog-centric organisation but we care about people too.

We support animal rescuers experiencing vicarious trauma, burn out and compassion fatigue.

Our campaign Move It For Dogs aims to encourage dog lovers to get active. Inclusion is extremely important to us, we encourage less able dog lovers to join in with regular contact sessions.

Dog Desk Animal Action CIC provided £100,000 to vulnerable dogs in the southeast of Turkey as of May 2023.

We provided huts for shelter, funded a fully equipped clinic, food and water troughs & bowls & blankets. Supported hundreds of dogs each day with food and clinical support.

Our clinical fund supports victims of hit and run, sexual assault, beatings, disease, shootings and sadistic behaviour from humans.

Homeless dogs have received routine treatments to protect them against parasitic infection

We fund routine vaccinations for puppies to protect them against common but often fatal disease & provide rabies vaccinations in several global locations.

The clinic we funded in southwest Turkey has been used to spay & neuter dogs & to treat minor ailments.

We would like to fund more clinics in the poorest areas.



Population reduction is vital to prevent suffering.

It is well accepted that just one mating and all the offspring over a six year period has the potential to produce in excess of 60,000 unwanted puppies.

Many of those puppies will not survive long as they are exposed to danger the second they are born.

Disease, hunger, loss of their mother, traffic & human harassment all pose great risks to the pups.

Those which survive face a tough life on the streets where only the strongest survive.

It is not a good life.

Female dogs live in a perpetual state of pregnancy, nursing and being bothered by boy dogs.

Male dogs roam out of their territories looking for females often suffering violence
